

Academic Disruption Has Ended All Academic Activities Resume Wednesday, April 1, 2015

Communication from the Executive Committee of Senate

March 31, 2015

Members of CUPE 3903 unit 1 and unit 3 have voted to ratify an agreement with the University and end their strike. As a result, the Executive Committee of Senate declares that the disruption of academic activities that began on March 3, 2015 **has ended**.

Academic activities resume in full on Wednesday, April 1, 2015.

This declaration has been issued by the Executive Committee of Senate in accordance with its responsibilities under Senate's Policy on the Academic Implications of Disruptions or Cessations of University Business Due to Labour Disputes or Other Causes. Of particular importance is the framework document "Completion of Courses / Guidelines for Remediation and Accommodation" issued on March 26 and subsequently revised.

Please bear in mind that the principles of the Disruptions policy -- **academic integrity**, **fairness to students and timely information** – together with specific guidance in the "Completion of Courses" document will continue to apply until classes and examinations for the Y and W terms have ended.
